It also suggests that there are effective activities and strategies in place to ensure that the children understand how important it is to be kind and caring, and what to do if there are any signs of bullying.

# 3. <u>Parent & Carer responses to the question</u>: 'What would you like to see Smallwood developing next?

Comment from Parents/ Carers	Our Response
More sport/PE	We have had considerable success with our Sports teams in various inter-school leagues and tournaments, this academic year. We are continuously investing time in our PE curriculum
More focus on IT/tech	This is most certainly an area that we will continue to invest in. We have upgraded all PCs in every classroom, invested in two new laptop trolleys with a total of 30 laptops and each classroom has new digital screens.
Early Years and year 1 extra-curricular opportunities	We are very conscious that at 4/5 years old the school day is quite long and one of our aims is to build that stamina.  We would be interested in hearing what further activities parents would like for Years 1 and 2
Free/less cost after school clubs	Some of our clubs are free and some have a small charge or are run by an external provider. We try and provide free clubs where possible but with ever-increasing pressures on our school budgets, we are not in a position to subsidise some clubs and provide the equipment and necessary resources. Clubs such as Cookery, board games, gardening (and others) come with costs for materials, staff time, ingredients and resources.  We consulted with the Parents' Council on charging for clubs and engaging external providers and there was an agreement for this.
Car Park/Pick-up/A car park for the parents	There have been a few comments recently about the "quality" of parking and how quickly some cars are travelling through the lanes around school.  We are very lucky to have the use of the Village Hall and we cannot, and will not, be policing it - we are relying on you, our parents, to use it in a sensible and courteous manner.  It has also become apparent that some cars are still parking on the corner of Church Lane/School Lane. This has caused some very near-misses as others having been pulling out of the junction.  We are very proud of our relationships with the community and its members and we all have a part to play in that.

French incorporated into lessons	Teaching a modern foreign language is only required at some point in Key Stage 2. However, we teach it from EYFS through to Year 6 as we believe strongly that learning another language early makes it far easier than later on. More trips out	We would love being able to take each class on a trip every term and residential visits from Year 2 through to Year 6 each year. However, we are very mindful of the costs of these and the pressure this would put on some of our families. We are looking at getting a balance over the year, for each year group and would welcome further feedback on this.
More dressing-up days	We understand the desire to celebrate and mark various occasions and theme days. However, we are also mindful that days like this affect our neuro-diverse children greatly and try to balance everyone's needs and differences. We aim to do 1 dress-up/own clothes day per half-term.
More stretch for academically able children	We have overhauled our curriculum from this academic year with far higher expectations, broader and more balanced with a focus on depth of learning. EYFS outdoor area to be developed/enhanced/upda ted	We would very much like to enhance our outdoor areas and expand the amount of space we have. We have some ambitious plans being drawn up in the hope of applying for grant funding. We will do everything we can, in the meantime, to make sure that the children have enough space and opportunity at playtimes and lunchtimes.
