

Continents

Europe—The continent between Asia and the Atlantic Ocean. Europe is in the Eastern Hemisphere.

Asia—The largest continent, in the Eastern Hemisphere.

Africa—The second largest continent, south of Europe. It is in the Eastern Hemisphere.

South America - The fourth largest continent. It is in the Western Hemisphere.

North America— The third largest continent. It is in the Western Hemisphere.

Australasia—The continent of is often referred to as

Australia. It has about 28 countries and island groups.

Countries

China—A country in eastern Asia. The capital is Beijing.

India—A country in southern Asia. The capital is New Delhi.

Costa Rica—In central America. The capital is San Jose.

Canada—A country in North America. The capital is Ottawa.

England / Spain / Germany / France / Greece—All located in Europe.

continent	A very area of land that includes all the islands with it.
globe	The world; planet earth.
map	A picture of a particular area of the earth or sky drawn or printed to scale on a flat surface.
atlas	A book of maps, tables, or charts.
equator	An imaginary line drawn around the middle of Earth., dividing it into the Northern and Southern Hemispheres.
North Pole	Farthest point north on earth's surface.
South Pole	Farthest point south on earth's surface.
population	The number of people that live in a particular place.
landmark	A well-known building or place.
climate	The usual weather conditions of an area.
