

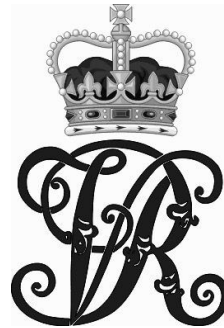
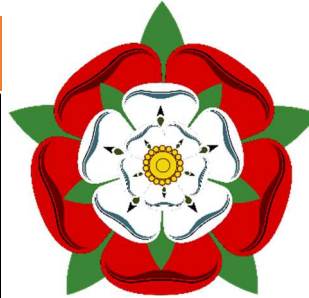

TUDORS

- Elizabeth I was the daughter of Henry VIII.
- Tudor clothing was lavish. Wealthy Tudors' clothes would be decorated with gold and jewels. Middle class Tudors' clothes were much plainer and poor Tudors would wear simple, loose fitting cotton clothes.
- In Tudor schools boys were educated for work and the girls for marriage and running a household. The wealthiest families hired a tutor to teach the boys at home.



VICTORIANS

- Victoria was Queen for almost 64 years.
- The Victorians dressed in clothes appropriate to their age, and position in society.
- Cars and trains were invented during these times.
- Not many people could read or write but Queen Victoria made all children go to school.
- Children would go to school 9am-12pm go home for lunch then go back to school 2pm-5pm.
