arctic	The area around the North Pole.
ice sheets	A layer of ice covering a large area for a long amount of time.
glacier	A slow moving mass of ice.
tundra	A large, flat, treeless areea of land.
Northern Hemisphere	The half of the Earth north of the equator.
sea ice	Frozen sea water.
adaptation	The process of change whereby a species be-comes better suited to its environment.
permafrost	A thick layer of soil below the surface that is below freezing.
Indigenous people	The culturally, ethic distinct group of people whose members descended from the first inhabitants of an area.
